In this full-time position, the teacher will work with students on campus four days a week. One day a week, there will be no student-facing responsibilities, and the teacher may choose to spend their extended planning time on or off campus that day. Apply here.

Responsibilities

<u>Instruction</u>

- 3. Manage classroom behavior in a positive and supportive manner
- 4. Present curricular material in a clear, fresh, and relevant manner, using various media, activities, and groupings
- 5. Actively seek ways to integrate curricula across disciplines
- 6. Prepare and maintain materials and supplies that enhance learning
- 7. Individualize instruction to meet students' needs:
 - Learn students' preferred learning modalities, current understandings, and skill level
 - Work to close gaps in learning
 - Seek additional resources
 - Encourage students to help one another
 - Create time to work individually with children
- 8. Design assessments that are reasonable and valid measures of student progress and understanding
- Demonstrate consistency in grading and return graded materials promptly
- 10. Use assessment results to improve/refine instructional practice

Program Design

- 1. Research and make recommendations regarding best practices in implementing personalized learning
- Identify and implement opportunities for multi-disciplinary project-based learning
- 3. Develop a framework for a student capstone project
